

# Public transport



#### General rules of the game

- All matches in both pools (A, B) will be played according to the FIVB Volleyball Rules, except as specified below.
- The net height is 2.43 m in pool A and 2.35 m in pool B.
- Only players mentioned in a team's subscription form are permitted to play for that team.
- If a team becomes incomplete (due to injury etc.), the 2014 EVS organisers and the leaders of opponent teams will cooperate to find other player(s) to add to the team concerned, preferably selecting them from players who have not yet played any match.
- Teams may play with 4, 5 and/or 6 players on the court. At all times during the match there must be at least 2 women on the court. There are no other limits with respect to gender or number of players.
- Player substitutions can be performed freely, as long as the 2-women rule is always respected.
- Each team has the right to designate up to two specialist defensive players: Liberos.
- The Libero player(s) must wear a kit with a different dominant colour from any colour in the rest of the team.

#### This kit must clearly contrast with the rest of the team.

- Only one Libero may be on court at any time.
- The Libero is allowed to replace any player in a back row position. The "two women" rules still applies.
- The Libero is restricted to play in the back row and is not allowed to complete an attack hit from anywhere (including playing court and free zone) if at the moment of contact the entire ball is above the top of the net.
- The Libero must not serve, block or attempt to block.
- Teams change ends after the first set.
- There is a 2-minute interval between sets.

- The referee and leaders of both teams must check and sign the match record for each completed match.
- The match schedule is provisional and intended to give only rough information on start times; it is therefore subject to change during the tournament.
- Each match is expected to last about 25 minutes. All teams are urgently requested to be on court as soon as their previous match has finished in order to be able to start the next match as soon as possible.
- The maximum interval between two matches is 5 minutes (warm-up time).
- The tournament organisers reserve the right to adjust the tournament playing mode during the tournament in case of a time delay, or for other reasons.
- In all cases not foreseen by these rules, the tournament organisers will make the final and indisputable wdecision.

#### Specific rules of the game in basic groups:

- Each team plays against every other team in the group.
- All matches in basic groups of both pools (A, B) are played over two sets (and therefore may finish with a 2:0 victory or a 1:1 tie).
- In both pools a set is won by the team which first scores 15 points, with no minimum lead required (i.e. a match might end 15 14).
- No time-outs are allowed.
- If any team in the basic groups is not present on the court at the scheduled time, when the referee starts the match after the 5-minute warm up the missing team shall forfeit the first set 0 -15.
- If any team in the basic groups is still missing from the court 10 minutes after the referee started the match, then 15 minutes after the scheduled time (5-minute warm up plus 10 minutes of waiting) the missing team shall forfeit the match 0 2 (0 15, 0 15).

#### Team ranking in the basic groups:

- For a 2 0 victory the winner gets 3 points, the loser gets 0 points.
- For a 1 1 tie the team which scored most points overall gets 2 points, the other team gets 1 point.



• Where the total numbers of points are equal, both teams gets 1.5 points.

#### Final ranking in basic groups is determined on:

- Highest number of points won in all matches in the group.
- Highest quotient of sets (won lost) in all matches.
- Highest quotient of ball points (won lost) in all matches.
- Highest number of sets won in all matches.
- Highest number of ball points won in all matches.
- Result(s) of the match (matches) of tied teams.
- Result of drawing lots.

When all matches in all basic groups have been played, the final ranking will be determined in the play-off (play-up and play-down) according to the tournament scheme.

#### Specific rules in the play-off (play-up and play-down):

- All matches are over one set.
- A set is won by the team which first scores 25 points (may end 25 24).
- Teams change ends after one of the teams has scored 12 points.
- One time-out per team per set is allowed.

#### Specific rules in the finals of all categories:

- Final matches in all categories will be played over two sets to 25 points with a minimum lead of 2 points.
- In the case of a 1:1 tie, the deciding third set is played to 15 points with a minimum lead of 2 points.
- Two time-outs per team per set are allowed.

#### Rules of the Draw:

#### Pool A

- 1. 10 teams are divided by a draw into qualifying groups A and B; 5 teams per group.
- 2. All teams are drawn from one basket only.
- 3. Teams are drawn alternately to group A and group B.
- **4**. Teams from the same country cannot meet in the same qualifying group. This applies to the following countries: France and UN Geneva.
- 5. When a French (or UN) team is drawn for one group, the other French (or UN) team automatically goes in the other group.

#### Pool B

- 1. 31 teams are divided by a draw into qualifying groups: G, H, I, L, M, N, O, P; 4 teams for each of the first 7 groups and 3 teams for group P.
- All teams are drawn from one basket only. Teams are drawn to qualifying groups consecutively from group G to group P.

- Teams from the same country should not meet in the same qualifying group. This applies to the following countries: France, Czech Republic, Germany, Holland, Italy, Poland, Sweden and Switzerland.
- 4. When a team from a given country is drawn for one group, that team should go in the first group in which that country is not yet represented. If this is not possible because the eligible group(s) are already full then the drawn team will go in the original group for which it had been drawn.
- For example, if the Italy Dream Team was drawn to Group G. Since Italy 1 is already in Group G and Italy 2 in Group H, Italy Dream Team automatically goes to group I.






